He said, sadly, in recent times many natural disasters had claimed hundreds of thousands of lives and involved billions of dollars' worth of property in the blink of an eye, and Malaysia had not been spared from being tested by natural disasters such as floods, landslides, haze, storm, drought and tsunami.

"Truly every disaster that has come upon this country or any other in this world must be our lesson and it has made us aware that property is a loan and this world is temporary, so let us work together and unite to prosper on God earth at its best.
