UUM FOUNDATION STUDENTS CLINCHED 4 BRONZE MEDALS AT THE 3RD MALAYSIA ASASI GAMES



UUM ONLINE: Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM) through its Centre for Foundation Studies in Management successful clinched four bronze medals at the 3rd Malaysia Asasi Games (MAG) at Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS), recently.

At the three-day championship which began from 17 January, UUM was represented by 31 students of the Centre for Foundation Studies in Management Programme. They won four bronze medals through events namely the men's and women's futsal, sepak takraw and team carom, placing UUM at the 9th position out of 13 competing foundation centres.

Deputy Director (Student Development), UUM Centre for Foundation Studies in Management, Dr Mohamed Ali Haniffa expressed his elation with the achievement because even though the UUM Foundation Centre had only 204 students compared to other foundation centres with

thousands of students, the Centre was still able to provide quality athletes that earned UUM four bronze medals.

"Their fighting spirit was high, in fact three coaches who are also alumni of the Centre from the third Cohort also sacrificed their time and money to train the athletes," said he who was the Contingent Leader at the MAG.

Fellow athlete, Mr. Syafiq Mirza expressed his gratitude that his team had achieved more than expected.

"Although bound by the rigorous academic schedule, the athletes from the Centre for Foundation Studies continued to train hard and the experience was indeed very meaningful for me and the team, thus motivating us to represent UUM as we pursue our undergraduate studies," he said.

The Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) Centre for Foundation Studies emerged as the overall winner of the championship, followed by the University of Malaya (UM) Centre for Foundation Studies in Science (PASUM) in second place and the International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) Centre for Foundation Studies was in third place.

The 3rd. MAG Championship organised by the Dean/Director of the Centres of Foundation Studies of Malaysia Public University was aimed at discovering new talents in the field of athletics, as well as becoming catalyst for the development of network of friendships among the denizens of centres of foundation from across the country.

More than 700 athletes from 13 Foundation Centres and Matriculation Centres in Malaysia participated. Among the Foundation Centres included those from UM, UKM, UPM, IIUM, UMS and USIM.

The opening ceremony of the championship was officiated by UNIMAS Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and International) Professor Dr Ahmad Hata Rasit.
